Course Title and Grade: Composition 10

Course Description

Composition 10 is designed to support students in their development of written communication through a critical process of questioning, exploring, and sampling. Within a supportive community of writers, students will work individually and collaboratively to explore and create coherent, purposeful compositions. Students will read and study compositions by other writers and consider a variety of styles as models for the development of their writing. The course builds students' writing competencies by introducing them to varied structures, forms, and styles of compositions. They also develop their craft through processes of drafting, reflecting, and revising.

Course Expectation

Students are expected to login regularly. Two-credit courses are to be completed in approximately two months. Some testing will be done under the supervision of a teacher.

Enduring Understanding/Big Ideas

- The exploration of **text** and **story** deepens our understanding of diverse, complex ideas about identity, others, and the world.
- Texts are socially, culturally, geographically, and historically constructed.
- Engagement with writing processes can support creativity and enhance clarity of expression.
