Law Studies 12:

Course Description

Law Studies 12 introduces students to Canadian, provincial and municipal laws and their impact on society. Students debate, discuss and analyze criminal law, civil law, family law and First Peoples' legal concepts. This is largely a project-based course.

Course Expectation

Students are expected to login at least 3 times per week and are expected to complete the first assignment within 2 weeks of enrolling. The course should be completed within 5-months. They are expected to be in communication with their teacher when they have questions and if they need additional support. Students are expected to submit their own work and to be honest with their assignments.
