

Graduation Information

Graduated or Not Graduated

It is important that you understand what it means to be “graduated” in your home country. Graduation means you have completed all levels of education that lead to entering a university or post-secondary institution. In BC, this means you have completed your **Dogwood Diploma**.

If you tell us that you are *graduated*, it means you will **not** be able to graduate again in BC. However, you will be allowed to take a [selection of free classes](#) to increase your knowledge and gain prerequisites for university or post-secondary programs.

If you tell us you are *not graduated* anywhere in the world, it means you **will be eligible to graduate in BC** and may take any classes you want that lead to graduation.

Adult Graduated Students

Adult graduated students are individuals who have already completed the requirements to graduate from high school anywhere in the world. They are limited to taking only specific **free courses** to improve academically or advance in their career, and they **cannot graduate again in BC**.

Free Courses Available:

- Math Levels 4–7 (Foundations)
- Mathematics: Foundations of Math 11, Pre-calculus 11, Workplace Math 11, Pre-calculus 12
- Sciences: Anatomy & Physiology 12, Life Sciences 11, Chemistry 11/12, Physics 11/12
- English: English Studies / English First Peoples 12, Literary Studies 11

Adult Non-Graduated Students

Adult non-graduated students are individuals who have not yet completed high school graduation requirements in BC or anywhere else. They are eligible to take **any free course** that leads to the BC Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood) or the Adult Graduation Diploma (Adult Dogwood).
